Some Quick Reminders!



Avoid Collections - To avoid Collections, your Account must be paid in full by April 15th. Any accounts not paid in full by that deadline may be sent over to collections and subject to additional fees and restrictions. Payments can be made online or in the office.



Yard Violations - Grass must be healthy and green with no missing or bare patches. Lawns must be kept mowed, edged, and weed free every week. All shrubs and trees must be trimmed neatly, and any dead plants must be removed. Avoid receiving a violation by maintaining your yard.



<u>Dogs in Waterleaf</u> - Please remember that dogs must be kept on a leash at all times when walking in the community. This is for the dogs safety as well as your neighbors. Any waste is also your responsibility to clean up. Any waste left on HOA property or any dog not properly contained or leashed could result in fines from the HOA and/or a ticket and additional fines from the City.
